Utility Billing Changes Next Month

SF Stormwater Management Fee

Contracted prices for trash service were lowered by \$2 on the new service agreement with Waste Connections. The City chose to reallocate those funds toward stormwater management without increasing water rates or taxes for customers who use the preferred provider, Waste Connections.



FLAT RATE = \$2.00

This fee will go towards maintaining and replacing stormwater items in the City such as:



Culverts

Pipes used to allow water to flow under a road, railroad, etc.

Curbs

Directs excess rain and ground water to designated drain

Storm Drains

Drains excess rain and ground water from streets, parking lots, sidewalks, etc.



