


Arbor Day Many residents gatherered to honor


ICTrees for gifting 34 tree saplings to the City of Bel Aire in the fall of 2018.

Bel Aire residents were able to make a splash and enjoy the city's first Dive in Movie Night.










Central Park Addition

Bel Aire Lion's Club hosted their annual pasta dinner to raise money in order to serve their community.






Fall Festival


Bel Aire welcomed Fall with bouncy houses, a petting zoo and face painting.
